Establish a Quorum

Chair Jimmy Taylor declared that a quorum was present to conduct business.



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Welcome

Chair Jimmy Taylor welcomed committee members, and introduced Clark Price, Federation Chair, to say a few words. He then recognized Kinley Hartman with USDA-AMS. He also welcomed all other guests including the presenting contractors, QSBC Executives, CBB staff and those joining via Zoom. Lastly, he asked if there were any media representatives present and there were none.

Approve Agenda

Chair Jimmy Taylor asked for a motion and second to approve the agenda as emailed or amended. Andy Bishop moved, and Trish Dowton seconded to approve the agenda as emailed. Motion passed.

Approve Minutes – May 11, 2023

Chair Jimmy Taylor asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the May 11, 2023, meeting as emailed or amended. Cheryl DeVuyst moved, and Larry Barthle seconded to approve the May 11, 2023, minutes as emailed. Motion passed.

Financial Report and Available Funds for FY 2024

CBB Secretary-Treasurer Ryan Moorhouse presented the Beef Board's financial statements for the period ending July 2023. He reported that the Board's total assessment revenues for the first ten months of FY 2023 were approximately \$35.9 million. Mr. Moorhouse also reported on the changes in certain CBB balance sheet items since September 30, 2022. He presented changes in program expenses, USDA, Supporting Services and Litigation, and Administration expenses compared to the same time last year. Mr. Moorhouse then noted that the CBB had identified \$1,700,025 in additional funds available for the Beef Promotion Operating Committee to allocate to programs. This brings the total available funds to \$37,945,00 for FY 2024 programs. For comparison, total program funding for FY 2023 was \$38,550,000. He also noted that the total requested funds per the FY 2024 Authorization Requests were \$48,973,162, resulting in a "gap" of \$11,028,162 over funds available. Last year, that gap was \$9,464,037 based on total requests of \$48,014,037.

FY 2023 AR review and MOA Updates

CBB CFO Jeff Lutz gave the following AR review and MOA updates:

- Starting with FY 2023, all Authorization Requests (ARs) are required to be 1-year except for Research ARs.
- In FY 2023, a new policy was added to the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) in Exhibit B which states the following:

"The funding request approved by the BPOC as a part of the overall AR is by tactic. Contractors can move funds between tactics as part of the overall funded AR. When a tactic goes over its approved budget by more than 50%, CBB will require the Contractor to provide an explanation as why the approved funds were over the approved funding amount for that tactic within the AR."



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 Through the end of June 2023, no FY 2023 ARs have exceeded any tactic budget by more than the 50% threshold.

Checkoff Evaluation Committee Report

Cheryl DeVuyst, Chair of the Checkoff Evaluation Committee, recognized and thanked the members of the committee as well as Beka Wall, CBB Director of Evaluation & Outreach, for their time and dedication. DeVuyst also recognized QSBC members, Ann Wittmann and George Quackenbush. For the first time, the Checkoff Evaluation Committee has QSBC representation, which brings a state-level perspective to the committee and helps to strengthen the Beef Checkoff's state/national partnership and the stewardship of producers' whole dollar.
